The AEF awards the A+ School of Excellence® designation to schools that consistently demonstrate a strong commitment to academic excellence, respond success-

fully to the changing environment of education, cultivate learning-centered, safe school environments, and encourage innovative instruction by supporting teachers,

The A+ designation is valid for 3.5 years.

With the addition of Desert Meadows and Pase Pointe Dual Language Academy, Laveen now has four current A+ Schools of Excellence.® These schools join Laveen School (2022), and Vista del Sur Accelerated Academy (2020). Trailside Point Performing Arts Academy (2014, 2018), Rogers Ranch STEM Academy (2019), and M.C. Cash School (2014, 2018) have all been recipients of this award previously.
