The District recently completed a demographic study of Laveen and, in the next ten years, our population is projected to increase from approximately 58,000 in 2023 to 81,000 in 2032. This means a corresponding increase of approximately 3,700 students in Grades K-8.

### **Chef in the Garden Brings Soul Food to Cheatham**

Cheatham's partnership with Blue Watermelon Project brought a sampling of soul food and hands-on gardening for students through their monthly Chef in the Garden program.

Local chef Pam Coleman, of Mrs. C's Home-Style, made her delicious black-eyed peas recipe for the students to try. She taught them about the bean's rich history - how it came to America and how it has become a food that is celebrated in the African-American culture. Students then enjoyed a bowl of Coleman's flavorful peas accompanied by her famous cornbread.

With help from Blue Watermelon members, students harvested ingredients such as garlic from the campus gardens to be used in the recipe.

Blue Watermelon's Lou Rodarte taught students about the plant itself. He explained that it is often used as a cover crop that keeps the soil cool while also producing nitrogen in the soil. Then he showed them how to plant and grow the bean in Cheatham's campus gardens.

Chef in the Garden is a program by the Blue Watermelon Project and is provided through a grant by The Steele Foundation. Through the program, local chefs visit classrooms on a regular basis and introduce them to new fruits, vegetables, grains, legumes, and herbs. Students receive a lesson on the history of the select food, learn how to grow it, and sample a recipe. The goal is to increase students' access to fresh foods and expose them to a diverse array of healthy food.





## Superintendent Honored by State Association

Laveen superintendent Dr. Jeff Sprout has been named Distinguished Administrator for the Superintendents Division by the Arizona School Administrators professional association.

He was nominated by administrators from other school districts and was recognized at the group's summer conference and awards luncheon.

#### **Business Office Honored for Excellence**

Laveen has received the Association of School Business Officials (ASBO) International's Certificate of Excellence in Financial Reporting Award for the 2022 Fiscal Year Comprehensive Annual Financial Report.

This is the ninth consecutive year that Laveen has received the award for its commitment to transparency and high-quality financial reporting.





Twelve Rogers Ranch students visited the Biosphere in Oracle for the Southwest Space Settlement Design Competition. Rogers Ranch was the only middle school competing at the event against high school students from Arizona, New Mexico, Utah, Nevada, and California.

Students worked in teams to complete an aerospace engineering project. Their project was to design a vehicle to enable long-term surface exploration of Mars for the purpose of identifying candidate sites for a future settlement on the Martian surface. NASA scientists were on hand to assist students with questions or offer clarification. Teachers and other adults were not permitted to assist the students.

It was exhilarating to watch the students take what they were learning in 8th Grade science to solve problems on Mars. After the presentations, the scientists gave feedback to each team.

#### **District Launches New Parent Communications Tool**



The Laveen School District is transitioning to a new communications tool for the 2023-24 school year. ParentSquare is a robust communications platform that combines tools such as email, text, classroom updates, sign-ups, scheduling, and updates into one easy-to-use platform.

Laveen families can download the app or log in to the dashboard. From there, they will see secure messages from their child's teacher, classroom updates, classroom photo galleries, and school event calendars. They can sign up for conferences and volunteer opportunities.

ParentSquare is secure and is iKeepSafe certified in FERPA, COPPA, and student privacy. ParentSquare is a Student Privacy Pledge 2020 Signatory.

### Desert Meadows Hosts Summer Coding Camp, Developing Coding Cafe

Desert Meadows completed a three-week Summer Coding Camp as the school works to strengthen its computer coding signature program.

Twenty–five students in Grades 4-8 participated in the camp where they learned how to build and program Edison Robots, use Makey Makey to have everyday objects control a computer, and use Minecraft EDU to develop and use coding concepts.

Desert Meadows is the recipient of a \$20,000 donation from Vulcan Materials that will transform the school's library into a Coding Cafe for the 2023-2024 school year. The remodeled space will include room for classroom instruction, robotics, and computer console areas for the class's Apple and gaming computers. The space will feature high-tech lighting and areas for students to collaborate in teams.



Coding classes in Grades K-8 will take place in the new café as will the robotics and e-sports activities.

Officer Pizarro was nominated by Desert Meadows Principal J.P. Ketcham.


#### Laveen Teams Place at Statewide Math, Engineering, Science Competition

#### MCKINNEY-VENTO HOMELESS ASSISTANCE ACT

Are you currently experiencing temporary living arrangements due to eviction, job loss, or a traumatic event? Laveen Elementary School District offers services to families through the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act. The act requires that children and families who are in a temporary living situation be offered services and supports. Services provided may include enrollment assistance, nutrition services, clothing or school supplies, community referrals, and in some cases transportation. If you are living in any of the following temporary circumstances: with another family or friend due to financial hardship, living in a shelter, transitional housing, in a hotel/motel, or an unaccompanied youth waiting for foster care, you may fit the criteria for assistance under this act. ### Enroll your child in a Laveen school

Parents wishing to register their incoming child(ren) should visit the school of their choice to complete the registration process.

You may register online or complete a packet available on our website, www.LaveenSchools.org, or in our schools' front offices.

Vista del Sur is an accelerated school and students must take an assessment prior to enrolling. Paseo Pointe is a dual language immersion (DLI) school. Incoming students in Grades PK-6, for 2023-24, must enroll in the DLI program (DLI will expand a grade level each year).

Laveen schools also accept open enrollment of non-resident (out-of-district) students on a space available basis.

Bus transportation is only provided to those students who live within designated transportation zones.

Bring the following documents to complete your child's registration:

- Child's original birth certificate
- Child's immunization record
- Proof of Residence, such as utility receipt or lease agreement (refer to Arizona Residency Guidelines)
- Legal papers, if applicable, for custody
- Withdrawal form/report card from previous school
- Photo identification for parent/ guardian
