


## ELA

## SOCIAL STUDIES



We had a great time at our Trunk-or-Treat! Thank you to everyone who came out to celebrate the fun!








### Reading


This month the students are reading informational texts! We are focusing on identifying supporting details to help determine the main idea of a text.

We are starting our Life Cycle unit! Students will learn about the life cycle and compare the different life cycles of plants and animals.





The students are learning about devices and energy in this current unit and concept. They will be able to answer this question...



## 6th Graders have been spotted being amazing!





**ELA**: Students in both seventh and eighth grade have completed their first novel study! The submitted essays on them and we have now moved back into the StudySync curriculum.


**Math**: Seventh grade students have moved into a new chapter and have a quiz on lessons 1-4 coming up! Eighth grade students are moving toward multi-step equations!
