Dear Parents and Guardians,

Laveen is committed to the personal and academic wellness of each of its students. In response to the great work our middle-level teachers have done over the past couple years to strengthen our middle grades, we have added “advisory” to our 5th-8th grade schedules this year. Advisory programs are designed to create a strong support system that students need to develop academically, socially, and emotionally.

By leveraging a robust 5th - 8th grade advisory program within a student-centered class schedule, students are more engaged, supported, and have every opportunity to thrive on campus.

Advisory programs are a way to strengthen connectedness at the middle level (grades 5-8). At Laveen, our advisory program is a morning homeroom class in which a teacher from the same or another grade level meets with a group of students to provide academic and social-emotional mentorship and support, to create personalization within the school, and to facilitate a small peer community of learners.

Advisory is a safe place in which students form close relationships with other students and a trusted adult.

- They celebrate and promote an understanding of themselves and each other.
- They discuss and analyze themes related to personal experiences and the world around them.
- They utilize restorative practices to nurture positive relationships and resolve conflicts.

Advisory is an empowering place in which students take ownership of their learning and plan for success.

- They monitor their own attendance, academic progress, goals and time management strategies.
- They identify, utilize and advocate for resources that support academic and social-emotional goals.
- They translate ideas, concerns, and findings into individual or collaborative actions to benefit their families, the school and/or the greater community.

Please review the Laveen School District's uniform policy with your child(ren).

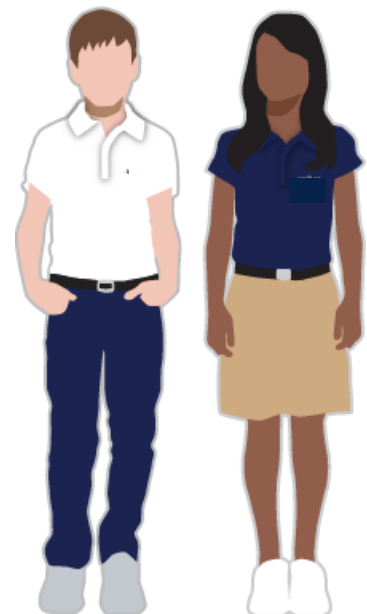

Outerwear/Jackets: Jackets, sweatshirts or sweaters in solid navy blue, white, gray, or light blue. Outerwear must be worn over an approved uniform shirt.

School-issued IDs and lanyards are considered part of the required school uniform and must be worn daily.

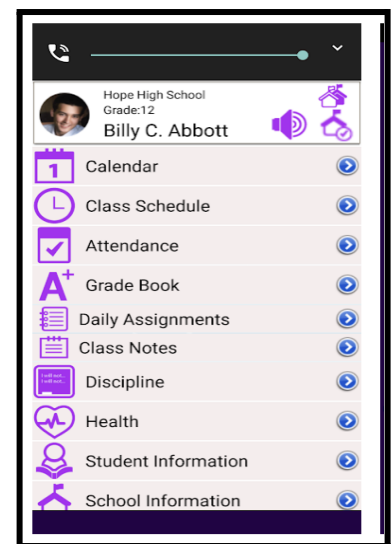
PARENTVUE WEBSITE AND PHONE APP

THE IMPORTANCE OF READING AT HOME

Reading at home has many benefits for your child. (So does reading to them if they haven't started reading on their own yet.) Here are just a few ways that students that read books at home will become stronger students:

1. Reading builds vocabulary.
2. Reading stimulates the brain.
3. Reading increases knowledge.
4. Reading strengthens concentration.
5. Reading relieves stress and anxiety.
6. Reading helps kids sleep better.

For most students, about 15 to 20 minutes of reading (or reading to them) at home at least three days a week is a good place to begin.
